


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TRADITIONAL



Banks

The banking industry includes domestic banks, foreign bank subsidiaries, full-service foreign bank branches and foreign bank lending branches operating in Canada.

The banks serve millions of customers; they include individuals, small and medium-sized businesses, large corporations, governments, institutional investors and non-profit organizations.

The major domestic banks offer a full range of banking, investment and financial services. They have extensive, nation-wide distribution networks and also are active in the United States, Latin America, the Caribbean, Asia and other parts of the world.

Many large international banks have a presence in Canada — through a subsidiary, representative office or branch of the parent bank. Most specialize in corporate and investment banking (e.g., niche financing) and have only one or two offices/branches. A notable exception is HSBC Bank Canada, which has a strong retail presence with branches across Canada.

SCHEDULE I BANKS are domestic banks and are authorized under the Bank Act to accept deposits, which may be eligible for deposit insurance provided by the Canadian Deposit Insurance Corporation.

SCHEDULE II BANKS are foreign bank subsidiaries authorized under the Bank Act to accept deposits, which may be eligible for deposit insurance provided by the Canada Deposit and Insurance Corporation. Foreign bank subsidiaries are controlled by eligible foreign institutions.

SCHEDULE III BANKS are foreign bank branches of foreign institutions that have been authorized under the Bank Act to do banking business in Canada. These branches have certain restrictions.

The Office of the Superintendent of Financial Institutions (OSFI) authorizes these institutions to operate in Canada. To view the OSFI list of all banks operating in Canada, <u>click here</u> and select "Banks."

CREDIT UNIONS

Credit unions are financial cooperatives. Their products, services and operations — and even their physical appearance — may resemble those of banks, but there are some major differences. The biggest ones are that they're locally owned and invest their profits in the communities where they operate; where their members live and work. In British Columbia there are 43 independent credit unions with 367 branch locations.

TRUST COMPANIES

A trust company is a financial institution that operates under either provincial or federal legislation and conducts activities similar to those of a bank. However, because of its fiduciary role, a trust company can administer estates, trusts, pension plans and agency contracts, which banks are not permitted to administer.

TAX CREDITS



Apprenticeship Job Creation Tax Credit (AJCTC) (Federal Program) A non-refundable tax credit equal to 10% of the eligible salaries and wages payable to eligible apprentices in respect of employment (maximum credit \$2,000 per year for each eligible apprentice).

If you intend to raise money directly from investors, the <u>British Columbia Securities Commission</u> (BCSC) wants you to know how to do it right. The BCSC is the provincial government agency responsible for regulating capital raising, securities trading, and investor protection.

The BCSC's "For Companies" section on its website will help get you started, and a call to BCSC Inquiries at any point along the way can save you from making costly mistakes.
